This year's wildlife conference is guided by the theme *Their Future is Our Future - Sustainable Development for Wildlife and People.* The conference will link between the Sustainable Development Goals agreed by the United Nations and international wildlife.

Oceans and marine resources play an essential role in human well-being and social and economic development. However, whales and dolphins, sharks, marine turtles and dugongs face bycatch, pollution, underwater noise, overfishing and hunting for bushmeat. At COP12, governments are expected to agree on actions to reduce harm to marine species.

Preserving terrestrial ecosystems and halting biodiversity loss is another major objective. Big cats are to benefit from a new initiative to be launched at COP.

New species such as the African Lion, all leopard species and giraffes will be proposed for be listing on the CMS Appendices. The Whale Shark and several species of vultures may be granted the greatest degree of protection.

Migratory birds are being illegally killed worldwide. A proposal to convene an intergovernmental task force to address this issue in Asia will be considered by COP12.
