ADMISSION OF OBSERVERS

Summary:

With reference to Article VII paragraph 9 of the Convention, the present document includes a list of agencies and bodies that have notified the Secretariat of their desire to be represented at the 12th Meeting of the Conference of the Parties (COP12) by observers through pre-registration.

Admission of these agencies and bodies will be confirmed at the beginning of the Meeting. Should any Party have an objection on the participation of any of the agencies or bodies included in the list, it is requested that they inform the Secretariat as soon as possible in advance of the Meeting.

Rev.1 accounts for agencies and bodies registered for the meeting after distribution of the original version.

ADMISSION OF OBSERVERS

1. Article VII, paragraph 9 of the Convention stipulates that

⁶Any agency or body technically qualified in protection, conservation and management of migratory species, in the following categories, which has informed the Secretariat of its desire to be represented at meetings of the Conference of the Parties by observers, shall be admitted unless at least one-third of the Parties present object:

- a) international agencies or bodies, either governmental or nongovernmental, and national governmental agencies and bodies; and
- b) national non-governmental agencies or bodies which have been approved for this purpose by the State in which they are located.

Once admitted, these observers shall have the right to participate but not to vote.'

2. The present document includes as Annex 1 a list of agencies and bodies belonging to the categories *inter-governmental organizations*, *national governmental agencies and bodies*, and *non-governmental organizations* that have notified the Secretariat of their desire to be represented at the 12th Meeting of the Conference of the Parties (COP12) through pre-registration as at 21 October 2017. Admission of these agencies and bodies will be confirmed at the beginning of the Meeting. Should any Party have an objection on the participation of any of the agencies or bodies included in the list, it is requested that they inform the Secretariat as soon as possible in advance of the meeting.
